What is the Society of Broadcast Engineers (SBE) and the Ennes Educational Foundation Trust?

The Society of Broadcast Engineers is the professional organization of television and radio engineers and those in related fields. The SBE offers the preeminent technical broadcast certification program in the U.S. and an expansive list of educational programs for broadcast engineers, operators, technicians, and broadcast IT professionals.

The Harold Ennes Scholarship Fund Trust was initiated by Indianapolis SBE Chapter 25 in 1980 in memory of Harold E. Ennes, author of many textbooks for broadcast and broadcast-related communications training and a member of the Indianapolis chapter. Ennes (pronounced "ENN-ess") was a member of the national SBE Certification Committee and made many contributions to the early development of the Certification Program. Chapter 25 transferred the Ennes Trust to the national SBE in 1981 to give it a national reach.

Scholarship History

Harold E. Ennes was an active member of the Society of Broadcast Engineers and was widely known as an author of numerous broadcast engineering maintenance books. In his memory, the SBE established the **Harold E. Ennes Scholarship** to award scholarships to individuals interested in careers in broadcast engineering.

Robert D. Greenburg was an active SBE member and held certification as a Certified Professional Broadcast Engineer (CPBE). The **Robert D. Greenberg Memorial Scholarship** was established to memorialize the contributions he made to the broadcast industry through his efforts as a bureau chief with the FCC.

The **Youth Scholarship** was established in 1999 to offer high school graduating seniors an opportunity to further their education with an interest in broadcast engineering.

John H. Battison was the founder of the Society of Broadcast Engineers. The **John H. Battison Founder's Scholarship** was created to recognize the instrumental role Battison played in the formation of the SBE. The creation of the scholarship was announced on September 11, 2012, which would have been his 97th birthday.

A new scholarship has been added to the Ennes Educational Foundation Trust, the **Gino Ricciardelli Scholarship**. Mr. Ricciardelli, who died in 2018, was a Charter, Life and Fellow member of SBE who, for more than 50 years, contributed much to the betterment of SBE Chapter 1 in Binghamton, NY, the National SBE and the broadcasting industry. Funding for the new scholarship is made possible by a donation from the Ricciardelli estate.

Criteria & Eligibility

To be eligible for **Ennes or Greenberg Scholarships**, candidates must have a career interest in **technical** aspects of broadcasting. These scholarships are typically awarded to applicants who have some work experience in broadcast engineering and who are interested in continuing their education in order to advance their careers. Preference is given to those who are employed at least part-time in broadcast engineering and to those who are SBE Members.

To be eligible for the **Youth Scholarship**, candidates must be in their senior year of high school, anticipating graduation by the spring of 2024. Candidates must intend to enroll at a technical school, college or university in the fall of 2024. They must have a serious interest in pursuing studies leading to a career in broadcast engineering or closely related **technical** field.

The **John H. Battison Founder's Scholarship** and the **Gino Ricciardelli Scholarship** are available to graduating high school seniors or those already actively employed in the broadcast engineering field. Either criteria described above, may apply to this scholarship.

Applicants must complete and submit this application to be considered for a scholarship. In July 2024, the Trust anticipates awarding five \$2,500 scholarships, depending on available funds. Applicants are limited to one scholarship award per year. At the end of the Award Term (July 1 – June 30), recipients will be expected to submit a technical paper of 400-500 words on a broadcast-engineering topic of their choice for potential use in an SBE publication.
